Slippery Slope

In this month's featured landscape, the homeowners started with a steeply sloped back yard. According to Rhonda James, president and founder of James Landscaping, Inc., the yard not only sloped from the back fence, it also sloped from left to right. This created a number of issues, but topping the list was soil erosion. No amount of soil nourishment could make up for the fact that the soil could wash away with a sudden downpour. The landscape team also identified a second problem. The existing retaining wall was made from railroad ties. Once a common landscaping material, railroad ties were regarded as a way to upcycle reclaimed wood. In fact, they are still available at some home and garden retailers. The problem: railroad ties are known to be toxic. The wood has been treated with creosote, a slurry of chemicals that the EPA has since denounced and is not recommended for garden use. As the wood decomposes, creosote contaminates the soil, posing a danger to plant and animal life. Clearly, it was time to say bye to the ties.

To address both of these issues, James Landscaping replaced the existing retaining wall with a new stone retaining wall. This is not a task to be taken lightly or trusted to the inexperienced. A proper retaining wall must not only look neatly installed, it must be properly constructed to withstand the immense forces of gravity. Fortunately for the homeowners, James Landscaping has years of experience installing retaining walls which have held up solidly over time. Additionally, the yard was regraded so that water travels across the yard, keeping the soil intact. With the slope addressed, the team could further enhance the appearance and usefulness of the yard with a flagstone patiocomplete with a shade arbor.



Growing In Phases

With our featured project, James Landscaping began working with the client in 2010. The first phase made a steep slope actually usable. In the second phase, the team got to work enhancing the property with a dry creek bed that would optimize water flow in the upper yard. They also worked with the existing trees in their yard by installing plant life that would thrive best with that specific environment. "Their trees provided beautiful shade, but it also made it hard for grass to grow," James explained. "We essentially replaced the grass with other plants that provided more texture, variety and visual impact. Today, you won't see any grass in the lower yard, but it's much more appealing."

It's so appealing and welcoming, that their neighbors had started coming over more often to enjoy the revamped space. Not only was it better for entertaining, it had become the kind of place where people wanted to linger a little longer to enjoy the pleasant surroundings.
